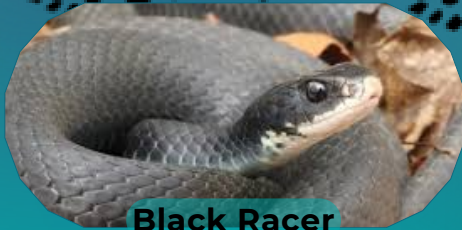

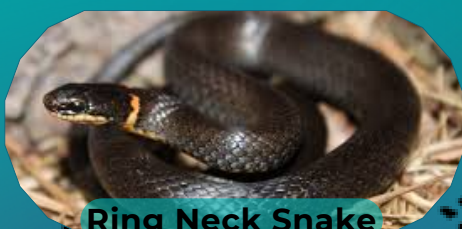

(VENOMOUS) FLORIDA COTTONMOUTH

The Florida Water Banded snake is often confused with the Venomous Florida Cottonmouth however, differences can often be spotted around the eyes, Florida Cottonmouth's have more narrow, "cat like" pupils where as the Water Banded has big, round "bug like" eyes, additional features such as banding on the jaw can also make it easier to spot the differences.

SAFETY TIPS

- Always watch where you place your hands and feet, especially when moving debris, firewood, rocks, or yard clutter.
- Wear thick gloves while gardening or performing yard work.
- If you encounter a snake, remain calm, step away slowly, and allow the snake space to move away on its own.
- When walking through wooded, overgrown, or high-grass areas, wear boots that extend at least 10 inches above the ankle for added protection.
- Be cautious around fallen trees, branches, wood piles, and debris where snakes may rest or sun themselves.
- Remember that a snake can strike from a distance of up to half its body length.

IF A SNAKE BIT OCCURS:

- Try to remember the snake's color, markings, and head shape from a safe distance to assist medical professionals with identification.
- Keep the victim as calm and still as possible to help slow the spread of venom if the snake is venomous.
- Seek immediate medical attention or call 911 right away.
- Do NOT cut the wound or attempt to suck out venom.
- Keep the affected area below heart level if possible and cover the bite with a clean, dry dressing until medical help arrives.
